## **Lobbyists Defeat Congress in a Tough Battle on the Court**

**Bethesda, MD-** Sporting red jerseys, a bipartisan team of congressional members--including **Rep. Jeff Flake** (R-Ariz.) and **Rep. Joseph Crowley** (D-N.Y.)--took to the basketball court at George Washington University last month against a group of powerful lobbyists.

Coaches from rival schools--Georgetown University Head **Coach John Thompson III** and George Washington University Head **Coach Karl Hobbs**--prepped the Congressmen and lobbyists. In pre-game interviews they compared the players to their regular teams.

Before tip-off, **Sen. John Thune (R-S.D.)** joked that the number on his mind was 911, and had his cell phone ready. Luckily, no call to the EMS was needed, but the MVP of the game was the oldest, **Jim Martin**, lobbyist for the 60/Plus Association- shooting three 3-pointers to help propel the lobbyists to a **45-36** victory.

Tension mounted when a visibly angry **Rep. Kenny Hulshof** (R-Mo.) alerted the entire room to a timekeeping error. Although he convinced the referee to add almost fifteen seconds to the game, it was not enough time to save the Members of Congress from its first loss to the lobbyists in five years. The result ensures that no ethics committee, even with the new Lobbying Disclosure law, will have to investigate giving Congress a win. Members joked during interviews that in the past the lobbyists have done well until the last few minutes of the game, when they would become “gimpy.”

This marquee match-up followed a battle between Hill staffers and younger lobbyists. Unlike their older and wiser counterparts, the staffers roundly defeated the team of lobbyists.
